



Northwest Ordinance (1787)


- When 5,000 free males of voting age settled an area, it became selfgoverning.
- When the population reached 60,000 free citizens, the area could apply for statehood. Ex.) OH, IN, IL, MI, WI
- Slavery was outlawed.




Why did the Articles of Confederation fail?

I. Currency Issues

- No common currency.
- States, Federal, and Foreign money was used





Why did the Articles of Confederation fail? II. Debt


- Congress could not tax the people
- No money = U.S. can't pay its debts!

Examples:

- U.S. owed France & Spain for loans made during the Revolutionary War & owed money to US soldiers

Shays' Rebellion

- Farmer's income decreased while taxes increased.
- Farmers who could not pay their debts had their farms taken away by the courts.
- Therefore, in 1786, Daniel Shays led a group of farmers in an attempt to capture a federal arsenal.



• The U.S., without an organized army, was powerless. Massachusetts sent a militia to stop the rebellion.

Why did the Articles of Confederation fail?

III. International and Domestic Problems

- The U.S. lacked military power
- States acted like countries

- Example:
- Shay's Rebellion proved that the federal government could not deal with problems



- Shays' Rebellion convinced many people that the U.S. needed a new, stronger government.
- The Articles of Confederation needed to be replaced!
